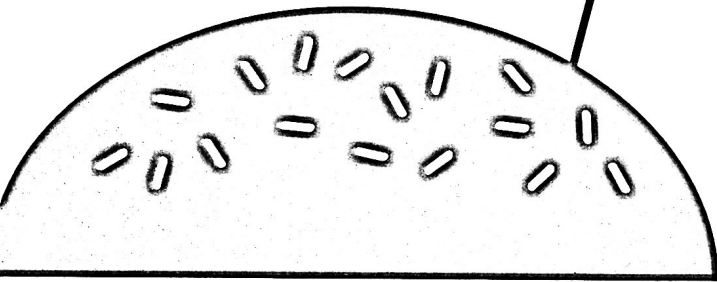
# Hamburger Paragraph
